




- ✓ A number of updates and new data points have been added to the Current Conditions document, and include:

Our objective is to improve walkability and provide access for people on foot or bike via a network of trails and sidewalks along the City's major spines.



Our objective is to enliven our existing and proposed retail centers with the events and features that attract people, develop authentic and enjoyable places, and prepare for the changing retail environment.



Our objective is to capitalize on the expansive park spaces that exist in Brecksville by developing clear connections between our parks and our neighborhoods.












FOCUS AREAS & CORRIDORS


