INTRODUCTION

ABOUT THE SURVEY

The Euclid Pedestrian & Bicycle Safety Action Plan Project Prioritization Survey was open for one month from October 19th 2023 to November 17th, 2023. The survey was hosted online with paper copies available at Euclid City Hall. In total, the survey was completed by 158 respondents, which included 1,058 answer selections and 302 written comments.

NEXT STEPS

The results of this survey and the comments provided by respondents in conjunction with other engagement efforts—including focus group discussions and input from community meetings—were used to refine and inform this Pedestrian & Bicycle Safety Action Plan's implementation priorities.

TOP 10 THEMES

Obtaining input from residents, employees, business owners, and property owners was essential in helping prioritize the recommended policies and actions for this plan. The following 10 themes were the most common among respondents.



The most important **roadway** for **improving pedestrian** and **bicycle safety** is **Lakeshore Boulevard**.



The most important intersection for improving pedestrian and bicycle safety is Euclid Avenue and E. 260th Street.



Respondents stated that **E. 250th Street** and **Lakeshore Boulevard** should also be considered for **pedestrian** and **bicycle safety improvements**.



Almost **60% of respondents** stated that it was **very important** that **Lakeshore Boulevard** be considered for a **road diet** with **on-road facilities**.



30% of respondents stated that **Euclid Avenue** should be considered for a **road diet**.



The **most important all-purpose trail connection** stated by respondents was **Euclid Avenue** (*generally*).



Over **80% of respondents** stated that the **most important area** for enhancing visual aesthetics, social interactions, and access to amenities is **Downtown Euclid** (Shore Center Plaza).



45% of respondents that use public transportation **access their transit stop** by **walking**.



50% of respondents stated **improving transit waiting environments** was **very important**.




The most important program and policy stated by respondents was collaborate with ODOT to develop an access management plan to help reduce curb cuts and conflict points between cars and non-motorized users.




IMPORTANT ROADWAYS FOR ROAD DIET CONSIDERATIONS WITH ON-ROAD FACILITIES

"I would love if Sims Park could be connected to the area north of the Senior Center. I also would like for the lakefront bikeway/ walkway to continue growing east."


"We need a trail connector from Euclid Senior Center to Sims Park for seniors to have direct access to the new Lake Front Trail."



"Think about how far benches and trash cans are away from each other, especially for senior citizens and physically disabled people."


USE OF PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION


IMPORTANCE OF IMPROVING TRANSIT WAITING AREAS

A road diet, or roadway reconfiguration, can help improve safety and calm traffic by reallocating space formally dedicated for automobiles. Road diets are a widely accepted, low-cost method for creating more livable spaces and complete streets, or streets designed for everyone. Road restriping, lane width reductions, crossing medians, and bike lanes are all examples of road improvements that can integrate road diet principles.
